

I AM THE GREATEST

Skills: Place value with 7 digits, comparing numbers

Players: 2

Materials: one die per pair, recording board

- 1) Player 1 rolls a die and selects the best place value position in their row. For example, if player 1 rolls a 2, the “tens” position might be chosen. Player 2 might roll a 5 and place it in the “ten thousands” position in their row.
- 2) Once the place has been selected, students write that number in that place on the board. It cannot be changed once it’s been chosen. Each player uses their own row.
- 3) Players alternate taking their remaining rolls, each building their own number – keeping in mind the goal of the game is to create the largest number possible. Students have one throw away roll.
- 4) Once all dice have been placed, players verbalize their number and compare them to determine the player that has made the greatest number.
- 5) Winner of the round is the player with the greatest number. Play as many rounds as you would like to find an overall winner.

Variation 1: Decrease level of difficulty by building smaller numbers.

Variation 2: Players can build the smallest possible number. A roll of 1 or 2 is now considered nice!
